A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR

A very exceptional year indeed! Fall 2019 started very strong with demonstrations for the planet across the globe, finally the climate crisis was widely covered in mass media and people all over were mobilizing to make change! People look toward their communities to do their part for the planet, and this is where church communities play an important role. The Green Churches Network is there to support, assist and inspire these communities. Communities use church buildings as focal points of neighborhoods, whether it's for religious ceremonies, other events or simply as a gathering space, there is no village without at least one church! January 2020 was the beginning of my role as the executive director of the Green Churches Network. Also noteworthy is the article that was published by the Catholic Register in early March 2020 about the Network and how we persevere to meet our goals and the role that churches play on the community level as examples of environmental stewardship. This article was also republished on the American Newsbreak website, as well as on the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon website. This type of publicity furthers our reach and helps build our network stronger. We are now in 5 provinces (BC, AB, ON, QC, NS) with goals to expand to all our Canadian provinces and territories!

With the onset of the pandemic and the lockdown restrictions we managed to maintain communications via phone and email, and were pleasantly surprised by the increased requests to our organization, people are rethinking their relationship to the environment, God's Creation. It is with a heavy heart that I say that our communities have suffered great losses due to this public health crisis and we hold you all dear in our prayers. May we come out of this pandemic stronger and build a brighter more sustainable future for all to enjoy through the protection of God's Creation.


Gregory Lynch

In August 2017, the Green Churches Network launched the first Season of Creation Toolbox. We are the only organization in Canada to offer such a resource, and it's free of charge!

What is the "Season of Creation"?

Every year, from September 1st to October 4th, churches around the world observe the "Season of Creation". Since 2008, the World Council of Churches has been promoting church participation in this special period of the year. Its popularity is growing in Europe and the United Church of Canada was the first in this country to celebrate it. The downloadable resources provided by the Green Churches Network make it possible for all of Canada's Christian communities to join in the annual celebration and reenergize their commitment as responsible stewards of God's Creation.

Why the dates from September 1st to October 4th?

In 1989, Dimitrios I, Patriarch of Constantinople, dedicated the first day of the Orthodox liturgical year (September 1st) to the protection of the environment. He then invited the whole Christian world to "offer together every year on this day, prayers and supplications to the Maker of all, both in thanksgiving for the great gift of Creation and in petition for its protection and salvation". In 2015, Pope Francis named September 1 as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. October 4 is the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology in the Catholic tradition. He is a model of integral ecology, where love for the poor, the sick and for all creatures flows from the same source.

WALK FOR THE PLANET

On September 27, nearly half a million people took to the streets of Montreal, plus thousands took to the streets of cities across Canada. This show of solidarity was to demand action on climate change from our governments. The Green Churches Network and our member communities were present in force. At the start of the march the bells of downtown Montreal Churches rang and even Saint Francis of Assisi appeared in the crowd.



The Green Churches Forum

In October 2019, the Green Churches Forum took place at the Notre-Dame-du-Cap Sanctuary in Trois-Rivières. This event was an opportunity for all of our members to share and learn while celebrating our faith and the gift of creation. The forum was a success thanks to our local volunteer committee, the involvement of several



environmental organizations and the participation of over 150 people. A big thank you to everyone!



This year all the workshops, conferences and activities were organized around the theme: the "gift of water". We had the opportunity to explore the importance of water in scripture, in our communities and for the environment. We had an

abundance of activities during the two days at the Sanctuary including: 14 conferences and workshops, 2 panels, 9 booths and a water ceremony.



We are delighted to see the interest of our community in the Forum in Trois-Rivières and we look forward to seeing you again the next Green Churches Forum.

Improving Energy Efficiency

We anticipate hiring professionals in the field of building energy efficiency. Reducing our carbon footprint is largely done through changes in our energy consumption. Our registered churches have expressed their need for information on finding ways to better maintain and improve the energy efficiency of their buildings. In the coming year we intend to develop the resources to respond to this need.

Recycling 101

This is a project supported with a grant from TD Friends of the Environment in order to help those who require assistance with basic recycling practices within their church buildings. Three-Year Plan

Our Action Plan for 2017-2020 is coming to a close; we have already started building our next Action Plan for the coming years. We are now in five provinces and we continue to work hard fostering relationships with our brothers and sisters outside of Quebec. Our goal is to have

regional ambassadors representing the network in Christian communities throughout Canada.

Season of Creation 2021

Our annual toolkit of downloadable resources for the worldwide celebration of the Season of Creation (1st Sept.-4th Oct.) will be available to churches, schools, religious communities and interested persons across Canada. Considering the slowdown of masses, ceremonies and

gatherings due to the pandemic, 2020s season of creation was less active than usual. We will be ready for a season of creation 2021 in the hopes that our communities can safely come together and gather in the name of Creation Care.
