A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR

A year for the history books! Adapting to changing public health restrictions in face of a global pandemic, we have leaned on community more than ever before. Over the past year, our neighbourhoods, our schools, and our churches, through collective strength and creativity, have forged new ways of adapting and in some cases, ways to simply survive. The resilience of communities and individuals is evident as people throughout the country have emerged with fortitude to stay positive and to seek solace where possible. Unfortunately, the public health crisis is not the only crisis that we are faced with. The climate crisis is ever looming and likes to make an uninvited appearance to remind us of the delicate fragility of the eco balance needed to sustain life, and that our dependency on this earth lies in the hands of Creation.

The year 2021 marks the 15th anniversary of the Green Churches Network; its origin as a project at St. Columba House in Montreal was made possible by the United Church in 2006. Considering the financial stress of church closures, our anniversary gift to our community has been to waive the annual fees for 2021. As usual, if this fee is ever an obstacle for a community, we are always amendable.

Our efforts this year have continued to be fruitful: our team has grown to include two student employees plus a conference coordinator; we welcomed a new president after the predecessors' three years of devoted service; our in-house Creation Care School offers free and affordable, do at your own pace, courses on Creation Care produced by our founder Mr. Lévesque; there are more institutions such as dioceses and communities that are joining the network, this is a great sign for the future as their reach is influential; publishing the 2021 Season of Creation toolbox required a lot of creative and collaborative labor, I am very proud of the entire team and would like to extend a special thanks to Bernice, Angelina, Aleyxa, Renaude, and Melanie for their valuable contributions.

Encouraging news for the year ahead; we have been approved for funding to move forward with our Energy Efficiency in Church project! This project aims to assist and support churches on their path to reduce greenhouse gases and their energy bills. A win-win as we all need to do our part to lower emissions to reduce global warming. The planet is heating, and loss and damage can be measured in lives and livelihoods. Caring for Creation has never been more urgent. SEASON OF CREATION 2021

Every year, Christians around the world observe the 'Season of Creation' from September 1st to October 4th. **September 1ST** is the first day of the Orthodox liturgical year and has been dedicated to the protection of the environment since 1989, by Dimitrios I, Patriarch of Constantinople. September 1st has also been named as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation by Pope Francis in 2015. **October 4TH** is the Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron Saint of Ecology in the Catholic tradition. He is a model of integral ecology, protector of the earth and biodiversity, and the symbol of a loving relationship with nature.

This "Season of Creation 2021", the international theme of 'A HOME FOR ALL, RENEWING THE OIKOS OF GOD' was aptly chosen as we all have experienced the effects of this global pandemic. Our common home has been greatly impacted, exposing the vulnerability of humankind; it is time to work together to make our earth A HOME FOR ALL. This year we have launched the first phase of our Energy Efficiency in Church project. The main objective is to help Christian communities in the process of reducing their environmental footprint through promoting, educating, and implementing energy conservation measures that improve the sustainable development of their communities.

Targets include reducing greenhouse gas emissions, reducing dependency on fossil fuels, improving energy efficiency, improving water conservation, and lowering energy bills. A key objective is to assist communities through support and guidance as they navigate the available funding option to help realize their goals.

RECYCLING 101 PROJECT

This ongoing project is supported with a grant from TD Friends of the Environment Foundation to help those who require assistance with basic recycling practices within their church buildings through education and support. Targeted to help churches that serve their communities through rentals to community and/or nonprofit charitable organizations.



ACTION PLAN 2021 - 2025

We are now in five provinces, and we continue to work hard fostering relationships with our brothers and sisters outside of Quebec. Our goal is to have regional ambassadors representing the network in Christian communities throughout Canada and to reach 250 green churches over the next few years!
