

From the Executive Director A YEAR OF MOVES, BOTH VIRTUAL AND PHYSICAL!

2017-2018 was a Year of Moves

The **virtual move** of our website platform required ten months of programming. But, it was worth all the work. What a success! The new site was an instant hit: more visits, PayPal payments, more email traffic, more networking, more churches interested in joining the Network.

The **actual move** to a new national office took four months of searching for a propitious location. But finally, what joy to be told on April 22nd during an Earth Day celebration at St. Francis of Assisi Parish that the priest and people wanted us to move there. Already part of the Green Churches Network for the last eight years, the church community said, "We would like to have you here at our home". Happy to accept this warm welcome, we set up our national office in June in the rectory of their sister church, St. Claire, in East Montreal.

Society needs the church as an ally in caring for the environment, and the church needs to be involved in the growing movement of eco-spirituality if it wants to be coherent. The more we give the Green Churches Network the means to be creative and productive, the more we will be surprised by the results and by its ability to stimulate an evolution in the Church's attitude toward the earth, our 'common home'.

National Office move

The Green Churches Team was invited on April 22, Earth Day, for the unveiling of the exterior sign "Proud to be Part of the Green Churches Network" at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church in East Montreal, already a "green church" for 8 years. After the ceremony, the pastor, Fr. François Baril, offered us office space in the rectory of their sister church: St. Claire, a 15-minute walk from the Honoré-Beaugrand metro station. He said, "We want you to be part of our home."



We visited the three rooms in the former rectory that now serve as our office. These rooms are about 10'x10 ', plus storage space, toilet and sink. As we did not have easy access to sinks and toilets at our old office, this is a blessing! We also have the use of a meeting room with a large table as well as a spacious balcony surrounded by large trees. Our modest starting rent is, for the parish, a concrete way of contributing to our mission.



We moved from Laval to East Montreal on June 16th. Apart from the heat, it was a day without glitches. With nine energetic and generous people involved, packing and unpacking the boxes and carrying the pieces of furniture upstairs (no elevator) went well. It only took 3 days for us to arrange the furniture, install the phone and computer systems and become functional again.

Fr. Baril together with the pastoral team of St. Claire Parish celebrated our arrival with a wine and cheese welcome on June 21st.

The inauguration of the national office of the Green Churches Network took place in the evening of July 5th and was presided by Most Rev. Alain Faubert, auxiliary bishop of Montreal. In his prayers to ask God's blessing on our office and on our work, Bishop Faubert was particularly attentive to the United Church and Mennonite green church associates who had come to pray and celebrate with us. He made a point of greeting each person and of circulating among us to chat and to serve drinks and

snacks during the light refreshment period. The weather was warm and a warm friendliness and "green" connection was felt by all.

We love the name of the beautiful church of St. Claire next door to us! St. Clare of Assisi, a 13th century Italian nun, was a contemporary of St. Francis and founder of the Poor Clare religious community. She was a great friend of St. Francis of Assisi and like him she lived a life of extreme simplicity and poverty. St. Clare also showed a great love for God's creatures, notably demonstrated by the garden she set up in the cloister to welcome the birds.

After 10 years of use, the Joomla 1.5 platform was outdated, causing many bugs and had to be replaced. In the summer of 2016, all articles were migrated to a Joomla 3.5 platform. The migration was rather a failure. Although this platform was beautiful visually, we encountered many problems in adding new modules, such as the boutique, statistics or the registration form. We lost about a hundred links and were hacked several times.

With the new communications assistant and given the help of a student during the summer of 2017, we decided to rebuild the site on a WordPress 4.7 platform. The reconstruction took 10 months of work. This site was launched on April 3, 2018 on the Tuesday after Easter. In a way, it was a resurrection of our presence on the internet. Comments on the new website have been very positive. One can easily navigate it from a computer, tablet or cell phone. The boutique on the new website will be functional by the end of summer 2018.

The new "statistics" function on the website will allow us to publish complete data next year. Since it went online (3 months), the site has received 3,474 visits.

Toolbox for The 'Season of Creation' 2017

In August 2017, the Green Churches Network launched the first Season of Creation Toolbox. We are the only organization in Canada to offer such a resource.

What is the "Season of Creation"?

Every year, from September 1st to October 4th, churches around the world observe the "Season of Creation". Since 2008, the World Council of Churches has been promoting church participation in this special period of the year. Its popularity is growing in Europe and the United Church of Canada was the first in this country to celebrate it. The downloadable resources provided by the Green Churches Network make it possible for all of Canada's Christian communities to join in the annual celebration and reenergize their commitment as responsible stewards of God's Creation.

Why the dates from September 1st to October 4th?

In 1989, Dimitrios I, Patriarch of Constantinople, dedicated the first day of the Orthodox liturgical year (September 1st) to the protection of the environment. He then invited the whole Christian world to "offer together every year on this day, prayers and supplications to the Maker of all, both in thanksgiving for the great gift of Creation and in petition for its protection and salvation". In 2015, Pope Francis named September 1 as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. October 4 is the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology in the Catholic tradition. He is a model of integral ecology, where love for the poor, the sick and for all creatures flows from the same source.

Coming up...

If 2018 was the year of developing ready-to-use educational resources for Christian communities, 2019 will be devoted to church councils, to providing tools for those charged with the management and upkeep of religious buildings (temporal affairs councils, stewardship councils, finance councils, facility and property managers, etc.). We will produce a new MAINTENANCE TOOLKIT, a compact guide which will illustrate how implementing improvements to the building can reduce its ecological footprint and be cost-effective as well.

We will design a self-evaluation guide for the religious building which will allow managers, to evaluate energy consumption (heating, lighting, electrical systems) and propose improvements. In addition to reducing the church's ecological footprint, these adaptations will actually save money. So, everyone is a winner because the church will be sustainable!



In September 2018, for the second year, we will offer churches a downloadable "Season of Creation" toolbox. It will contain spiritual, educational and action-oriented resources plus a 2018 Creation Care Calendar with suggestions of practical actions for each day from September 1st through October 4th. Although promoted by the World Council of Churches (Geneva) since 2008, observance of the Season of Creation is almost unheard of in Canada. Naturally, the Green Churches Network had to develop tools on this theme.

In collaboration with Our Lady of the Cape Sanctuary, recently registered in the Green Churches Network, we will organize the next Green Churches Forum to be held in Trois-Rivières, Quebec in autumn, 2019.

In view of making the green churches movement better known, we want to hire a first regional coordinator in Western Canada, if funding permits.

A letter of invitation will be sent to all Orthodox bishops, as well as to evangelical associations, so that more of their churches can be welcomed into the Green Churches Network. There will also be a special effort to stimulate the participation of Christian communities in rural and maritime areas. The Lord calls us to share the good ecological news in all regions!
